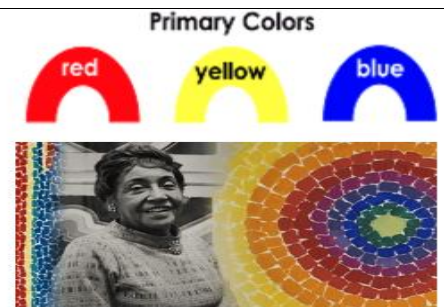
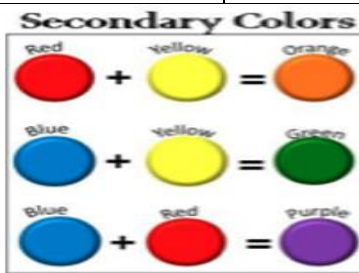


What are Primary and Secondary Colours?

Key Vocabulary	Definition	Art Skills
Primary colour	Red, blue and yellow. They cannot be made by mixing other colours together. All other colours are mixed from them.	Painting: Explore colour, the use of colour for particular objects. Develop colour mixing, including tints and shade. Continue to develop precise painting skills using sponges, brushes etc Collage: Understand that artists use collage express themselves. Understand that artists use a variety of materials to produce collages. Cut shapes from paper to make a creative response to an original artwork. Explore combining paint and collage to make a creative response to original artworks.
Secondary colour	Colours created by mixing two primary colours together.	
Tint	When white is added to a colour to make a lighter version of the colour.	
Shade	When black is added to a colour to make a darker version of the colour.	
Collage	A piece of art made from different pieces of paper, photos or other materials.	
Artist	A person who creates pieces of art.	
Abstract	A piece of art which isn't meant to look like an actual object or living thing.
