Baptism	Baptism is a Christian sacrament, where people are welcomed into the family of God.
Sin	Sin is disobeying God. It's doing things God has told us not to do and it's not doing things that God has asked us to do.
Psalms	The Psalms are a special collection of 150 poems and songs found in the Bible.
Covenant	A promise between people and God
Genesis	The first book of the Bible
Easter Sunday	The day Jesus rose from the dead
Noah	The man who God asked to build the ark.
Flood	When lots of water covers land
Rainbow	A symbol of God's promise to show he loves and cares for us
